

BUR OAK TREE



Bur oak is a large, deciduous tree with a very wide, open crown. Usually wider than tall, the tree can exceed 100 ft. in height and width. The massive trunk supports heavy, horizontal limbs and rough, deep-ridged bark. Leaves up to 9 inches long with a central midrib from which branch veins lead into rounded lobes. The acorns of this species, distinguished by very deep fringed, are the largest of all native oak. The homeowners cost is \$140.

GINKGO MAIDENHAIR



A Ginkgo tree may grow very slowly for several years after planting, but then grow at a moderate rate, especially if it receives an adequate supply of water and some fertilizer. The Ginkgo is adapted for use as a street tree, even in confined soil spaces. The homeowners cost is \$210.

50-50 Tree Planting Program



50-50 Tree Planting Program 2012-2013

Through its 50/50 Tree Program, the Village of Winfield shares the cost of planting parkway trees with homeowners. Residents simply choose the trees they want and send in a check for their portion of the cost. The Village does the rest.

The trees will be planted by a nursery contractor in the parkway adjacent to your home. Each tree is a minimum of 1.5 to 2 inches in diameter and comes with a one year replacement guarantee from the nursery. Parkway trees must be planted a minimum of 40 feet apart on all sides. Village staff will confirm the planting location and handle all of the planting details. Depending on the species, the tree may be planted in fall or spring. Overhead utilities may affect tree choices. Private property trees are not eligible for this program.

Orders, with checks payable to the Village of Winfield, must be received by August 15, 2012. The price listed for each tree is the homeowner's cost. TREES IN THE 50-50 TREE PLANTING PROGRAM

HACKBERRY



The Hackberry is a medium-size tree reaching 33-82 ft. in height. They are grown as ornamental trees, valued for their drought tolerance. Small monoecious flowers appear in early spring while the leaves are still developing. Hackberry trees grow at a medium to fast growth rate. The homeowners cost is \$140

CHANTICLEER PEAR



The Chanticleer Pear has a narrow pyramidal habit and good street tree resistance. Flower displays are showy, and the clean foliage is attractive throughout the summer months, presenting a slightly finer texture due to the narrowness of the leaves. Its maximum height is 30-50' high by 15-20' wide. Leaves are glossy dark green in summer, changing to a moderate purple-red in autumn. The homeowners cost is \$150.

KENTUCKY COFFEE TREE



This is a medium-size tree, rarely large. The Kentucky Coffee tree grows in moist soils with other hardwoods in eastern North America. Reportedly early immigrants in Kentucky used the large seeds of this tree to make "coffee." Woodworkers sometimes use the heavy, strong wood in cabinetwork, for fence posts, and in construction. Also, people frequently plant the tree as an ornamental. The typical tree height is 40 to 75 feet. The homeowners cost is \$160.
